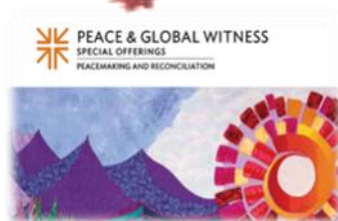

A Fundraiser for Doorstep, Inc.

The work has begun on the new HVAC system at the Doorstep building! Thank you to everyone who donated towards our 55th Anniversary Fund to make this upgrade possible, and completely paid for once complete!

The staff and volunteers have begun working on the Doorstep Christmas Adoption Project - 260 households with 800+ individuals will be adopted from the Christmas Bureau. The following items are needed:

School Supplies – about 275 backpacks with school supplies will be provided to school age children.

Hygiene Items for Health Kits – Every family will receive a health kit tailored to their needs. Needed items include shampoo, conditioner, bar soap, toothpaste, toothbrushes, combs, brushes, and deodorant.

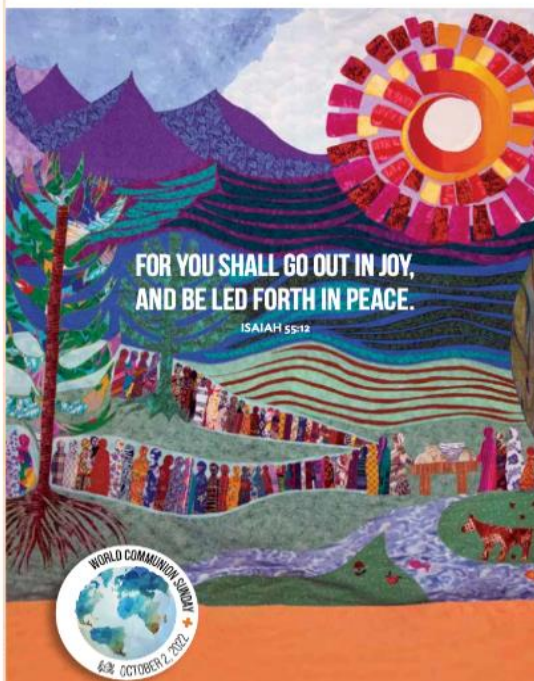

Every October, we receive the Peace and Global Witness offering, which as its name implies goes to global and local work for peace and witness. The PCUSA still has a global mission office that supports mission co-workers (missionaries) in over 50 countries around the world, including Joseph Russ, who will visit Trinity in September.



When you give to the Peace and Global Witness offering, 50% of the gift will support global mission projects, 25% will go to the Presbytery of Northern Kansas to support mission projects like Topeka JUMP and Talpetates scholarships. The remaining 25% will stay in Topeka to support Oxford House- community-based addiction recovery houses.





Yoga for the Young at Heart is changing to **CHAIR AND STANDING YOGA**.

We are focusing on balance, preventing falls, and stretches from a chair. We work barefoot to stimulate the nerves in our feet, helping with good posture and good balance and preventing falls.

Yoga's slow, gentle movements and stretching help to calm brain waves and de-stress our day. Yoga has many benefits of supporting healthy breathing, preventing pain by stretching muscles gently and allowing large and small muscles to gradually loosen for improved movement.

Yoga is done at one's own pace and ability. Yoga should never hurt. It helps keep us young with comfortable moving and allows us to prevent pains.

At Trinity, we use a rotation of several professional videos to follow so that we have the guidance of knowledgeable yoga masters without the cost! It's free and open to Trinity and non- Trinity members.

Carmen Raines will provide a blessing for all the animals both physically present and in-spirit. We are collecting new or gently used harnesses and leashes (no chain or retractable leashes) to donate to Dr. Crow.



Bring photos to add to the display in the foyer of your favorite pet (past or present). Pets and owners are encouraged to dress up and participate in the parade. Judges will be awarding prizes for: Best overall costume, best look-a-like, best family theme costume, funniest costume, and most unusual costume.

Pre-registration is optional but gives us an approximate paw count!***

Just a few guidelines:

1. All owners must be leashed or attached to a crate or cage as appropriate.
2. For the health at all, all pets must be up-to-date on vaccinations (and people should be too!).
3. Pets should escort their owners to the designated pet relief area. Pet must require their owner to clean up solid waste.
4. Pet watering stations will be available.

Hand sanitizer will be available at different stations for human hygiene.

This is likely to be a crowded event with many people of all ages and voices. If this may be overwhelming for your pet, please consider bringing a photo rather than the actual pet.

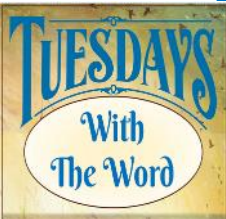

You are invited for coffee and spiritual fellowship time with Pastor Mere.

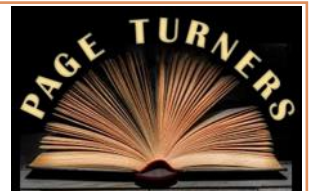
We meet at 9:00 AM on Tuesdays. We hope you join us for this very casual time of relaxed conversation.
