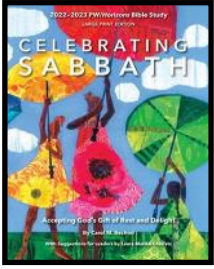

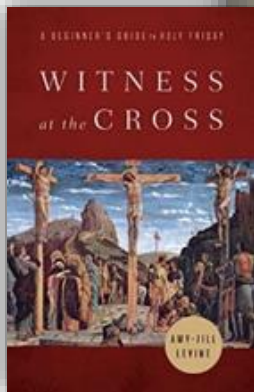
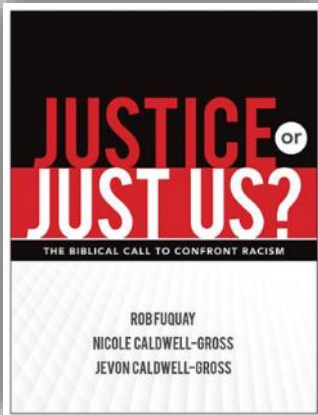


### January 15th – February 19th at 9:30 in Fellowship Hall

We will be studying ***Justice or Just Us: the Biblical Call to Confront Racism.***

Confronting racism is not just a social or political matter, but a theological one. The Bible calls us to pursue justice and oppose racism.

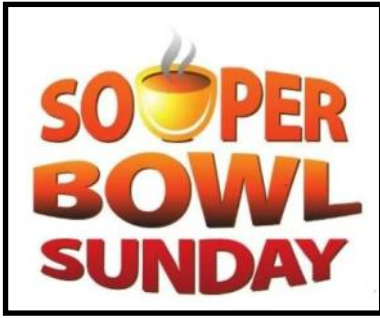
This video study is based on a sermon series and anti-racism commitment at St. Luke's United Methodist Church in Indianapolis. Pastors Rob Fuquay, Nicole Caldwell-Gross, and Jevon Caldwell-Gross will help us acknowledge the reality of racism in our world today, as well as our Christian responsibility to oppose it as individuals and together as the church.



Amy-Jill Levine reminds us that the story of Jesus's death is something we do not just read, we are meant to experience it. In ***Witness at the Cross***, she takes by the hand and walks us through the story, pausing alongside each of the characters to see and hear and feel how they individually experienced and were affected by it.

This is a remarkably personal immersion and participation in the narrative of the Crucifixion.

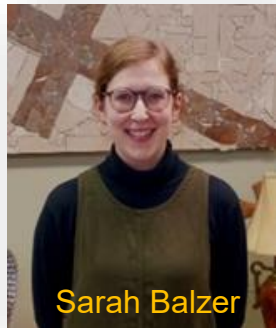

# TOPEKA JUMP



On Dec. 14, Topeka JUMP held a celebration banquet for JUMP's lead organizer, Shanae' Calhoun. Shanae' will be transitioning into a new position. Several people spoke about Shanae's work and thanked her for all she has done for JUMP and the Topeka community.

JUMP's new lead organizer is Sarah Balzer. Sarah grew up in Newton, Kansas. Before coming to JUMP, Sarah was an associate organizer in the Lawrence affiliate, Justice Matters. As Lead Organizer, Sarah will be working with JUMP's associate organizers Jake Regnier and Jason Maymon. Sarah is in the process of setting up appointments with team leaders of each congregation to introduce herself and to get acquainted with JUMP members.

JUMP is presently in its research phase. Research continues in the areas of Affordable Housing, Predatory Lending, Mental Health Crisis and Violence Reduction. Steering committees and general committees for each of these campaign issues have been meeting and will continue to meet and research throughout the next few months.

Trinity's Team Leaders, Anton Ahrens, Marty Peterson and Jane Williams, will meet on February 21<sup>st</sup> to plan Trinity's Network meeting which is March 19<sup>th</sup>.

## PREVENT FOOD WASTE

Everyone wants to save on food costs. It's also helpful for the environment to keep food waste out of our landfill, where it produces methane - that unhelpful greenhouse gas! To save on groceries and help the environment:

- ⇒ plan ahead - make your grocery list for the foods you will need so you don't buy more than you need,
- ⇒ serve smart - portion control is good for your waistline and good for reducing plate waste,
- ⇒ love your leftovers - pack leftovers in portions for your use, clearly marked with contents and date, refrigerate and use within 3 - 4 days or freeze immediately,
- ⇒ compost, don't trash food scraps, except meat and fat, can be recycled, with leaves and water, into compost, to become good soil. A small compost area can be set up in the yard or in a home compost bin.

# 2023 Stewardship Update



This year's stewardship theme was "I'm **IN**". "When we **IN**vest our time, talents and financial resources, God uses us to do amazing things."

We continued the effort begun in 2021 to educate and emphasize the importance of remitting annually to support "Per Capita". The commitment cards included the opportunity to pledge \$35 toward each member per capita. For the first year we raised \$3,615 and hope to match that number for 2023.

One-hundred fifty congregational members and friends were sent a letter with a commitment card enclosed. Eighty-three pledges were received totaling \$355,092. In comparison to the previous year, thirty-two increased their pledge, forty pledged the same, nine decreased their pledge, three were new pledges, seven did not pledge. For 2022, there were eighty-seven pledges totaling \$336,923.

During 2022, the committee took on a special project updating the membership rolls by contacting members who no longer attend activities or in other ways support Trinity. We were able to remove ten members from the roll and collected per capita from three additional members through this effort.

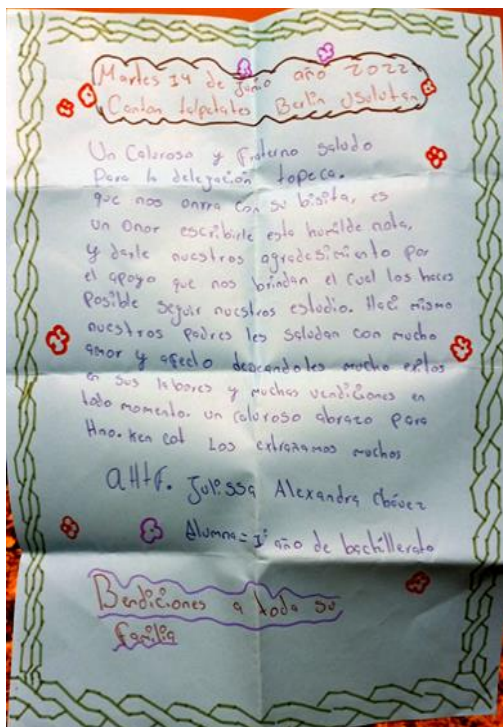

# Topeka Center for Peace & Justice

The Topeka Center for Peace and Justice is moving forward with providing restorative circles and mediation for our community. Recently, the Center promoted Nancy Kelley, who has many years of mediation experience, to interim program manager; received approval from the City of Topeka's American Rescue Plan Act grant for over \$100,000 for training and facility improvements; received special funding from the Sunflower Foundation to train more minority mediators; met with Shawnee County District Attorney Mike Kagay to discuss how TCPJ is beefing up mediator training to ensure we are ready and equipped for juvenile offender referrals.

In the spring, the TCPJ will provide training in core and parent/adolescent mediation for people of color through grants provided by the Sunflower Foundation and American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). The TCP&J is participating in the planning of a regional conference that will be held at Haskell University in Lawrence in June 2023. Areas of interest will be community building, social justice, restorative justice for juveniles and families, Native American/Indigenous influence of Restorative Practices and more.

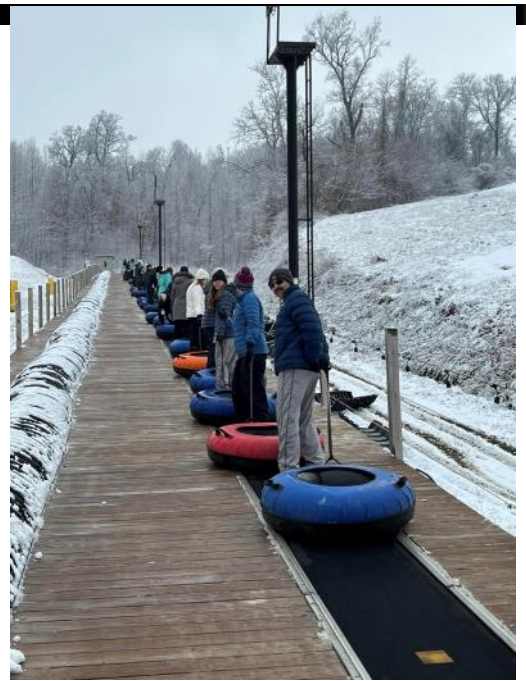
