


## Adult Sunday School

This is a remarkably personal immersion and participation in the narrative of the Crucifixion.


Join us beginning Sunday, February 26 at 9:30 in fellowship hall to begin our Lenten study. This study will continue through March 26th.

# TOPEKA JUMP



Trinity's justice ministry, Topeka JUMP, is in its research phase. Committees for the four campaign issues, Affordable Housing, Violence Reduction, Mental Health Crisis and Predatory Lending, have been busy meeting with various officials and community leaders. These meetings have been with such officials as City Council members, the Mayor, the new City Manager, former police chief Bill Cochran, KDADS Commissioner Andy Brown and CEO Bill Persinger of Valeo Behavioral Health Care. In addition, the statewide coalition, Kansans for Payday Loan Reform, which JUMP is a member, held a press conference at the state Capitol drawing attention to the need for Payday Lending reform.

The 30 congregations of Topeka JUMP are also busy planning and attending their congregations' Network meetings. Trinity's meeting will be March 19<sup>th</sup> after worship. Trinity's Network members are urged to attend, and anyone who wishes to know more about Trinity's justice ministry is welcome. Lunch will be provided.

At the Network meeting, JUMP members will get updates on the campaign issues and identify who they will invite to the Nehemiah Assembly, which is May 1<sup>st</sup> at 7:00 at Washburn University Lee Arena. They will also be reminded that JUMP's Rally is March 27<sup>th</sup>. At the Rally JUMP members will get additional information about the campaigns and a prelude to the Nehemiah Action Assembly.

## Green Corner

**GLASS RECYCLING** for Shawnee County is still available at many locations, including these 2 closest to Trinity:

**Lowe's** - SE corner of parking lot at 17th Street and Arvon Place.

**1st Congregational church parking lot** - SE corner as well, off of 17th on Collins - in the purple dumpsters with yellow tops.

Please place only BOTTLES and JARS in the glass bins so that we can keep the service. Please, NO porcelain, pottery, mirrors, plate glass, picture frame glass, tableware or drinking glasses, earthenware or glassware. These items go in the regular trash.

Also, remember to recycle your cardboard, paper, and hard plastics in your own home bin.

Plastics are not appropriate if they have # 6 in triangle as Polystyrene is NEVER recyclable.

DO recycle your # 1 or PETE or PET for Polyethylene Terephthalate plastics or # 2 in triangle HDPE for High Density PolyEthylene and # 5 PP for Polypropylene in the triangle.


**Trinity Family:**



## JUST HOW SIMPLE IS IT?

For the third year here at Trinity, Mission Committee member, Art Lancaster, has negotiated tax free, discounted prices for cases of a variety of food items that can be ordered from the Apple Market store on Gage Blvd. We just need to decide how much money we'd like to donate to this very important program and **place an order** by filling out the **2023 BUY THE CASE form\*** (on the next page.) And, to make it **EVEN SIMPLER**, Art will put in the orders to the store, and when they come in, he arranges the delivery to **DOORSTEP** as they come in so the food can be utilized right away. Thank you, Art!

You will see the **\*form** has areas to select the kind of food and quantity of cases you want ordered. Just add up the total price of those cases. Or, you can choose to donation amount that is "undesignated" gift which will be used to cover changes in food prices, and the balance will be given to Doorstep to purchase any additional food they may need. Fill in the check number if applicable and **PRINT** your name.






