








- * The Stewardship campaign is set to launch with the theme, "Stewardship is Heart Work".




ADULT CHRISTIAN EDUCATION COMMITTEE




Please plan to carpool (there is limited parking in driveway and no parking on either side of 18th Street).

The Youth Ministries Task Group is excited to announce the 2024 PNKS Summer Youth Mission Trip from July 20-26, 2024 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Trip Coordinated by YouthWorks and hosted by PNKS.

Join your (completed) 6th grade through graduated high school friends for a Mission Trip to Milwaukee, WI. We will spend the week exploring, serving, learning and growing.

On Saturday, July 20th, we will ride the train to Milwaukee, WI, and spend our first night at Immanuel Presbyterian Church. On Sunday, we will explore Milwaukee, and then start our mission work on Sunday evening, 7/21/2024.





Doorstep is sporting a fresh new look thanks to volunteers who painted and spruced things up during the Nancy Perry Day of Caring – thanks to all who helped!

Demand remains high for food – you notice your grocery bill going up? This has been devastating to many. **Doorstep has provided 12,000-14,000 pounds of food monthly to households in need, but since April monthly giving has averaged only 1,800-3,000 pounds**. That shortfall has caused Doorstep to spend in excess of

their monthly budget. Additional grants are being sought and received, but it is critical to maintain donations.

Critical needs:


