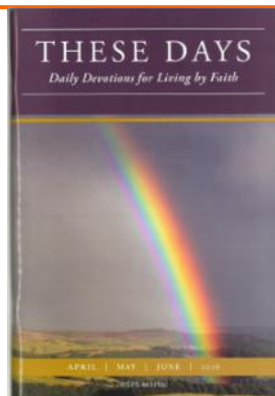

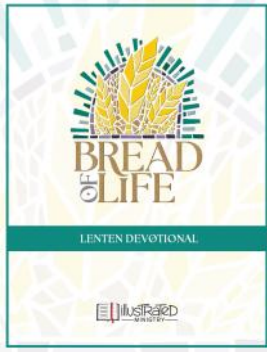

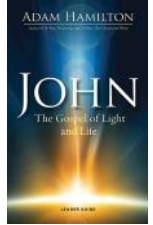

March is Trinity's Month to provide food for the DOORSTEP PANTRY

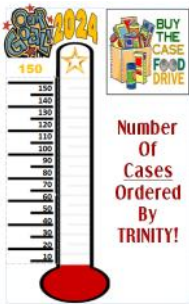


March is HERE! Which means its Trinity's turn to stock the pantry shelves at **Doorstep this year.** Which means the **BUY THE CASE** program IS UNDERWAY to assist in achieving that goal!

Time to pick up an ORDER FORM if you don't want to run to the store to buy the food you want to donate.

This program lets you donate cases of food using an **order form.** You just fill it out by selecting the kind and quantity of cases of food you desire to donate. Calculate the cost, send it to the church office and the Mission Committee will get your donation purchased and taken directly to Doorstep.

You can also just donate money. There is a place on the order form to indicate the amount of your undesignated gift. That amount will be used to cover changes in food prices, and the balance will be given to Doorstep to purchase any additional food they may need. Doorstep distributes the food we donate to those that need nourishment, and that number increases as time goes by making this program very helpful.



These food rates shown on the order form are discounted for by Apple Market for this program and are tax free. Many thanks to Apple Market!. As the month progresses, we will keep you up to date on how many cases we are providing with a thermometer at the church showing the current count.

BUY THE CASE ORDER FORMS ARE NOW AVAILABLE IN THE CHURCH LOBBY!

You will see the **order form** (see sample on next page) has areas to select the kind of food and quantity of cases you want ordered. Just add up the total price of those cases. Or, you can choose to donate an amount that is "undesignated" which will be used to cover changes in food prices, and the balance will be given to Doorstep to purchase any additional food they may need. Fill in the check number if applicable and PRINT your name.

Order forms and envelopes are now available in the sanctuary pews or in the lobby of the church. Or, you can use the form in this newsletter!

- *dropped in the offering plate in worship. Please be sure to **write BTC or Buy the Case in the MEMO** area of your check.

Please remember to use the “Memo” line on your checks so your financial gifts will be directed to the correct Donations Account – for example, “Pledge.” Checks are separated from envelopes, and a blank Memo line can create confusion in the counting process. Please assist our Accounting company partners!



Online-Bank Bill Payment:

A service offered by most financial institutions, which creates automatic recurring or one-time gift payments electronically from your bank account. Please use the Memo option for the check, designate Trinity as the payee, and have payments sent to:

Online-Trinity Giving:

You can find this option on Trinity’s website at www.trinitypresbyterian.net

Select the “Give” tab in the upper right portion of the screen and follow the instructions. Special Offerings may also be designated.

NOTE: This form of giving is especially *secure*. It will not be lost in the mail and cannot be stolen from the outdoor mailbox!

Cash:

Cash offerings should only be given in a worship service – do not mail! Please consider using a Pew envelope and label it with your name, if desired. If you do not indicate a fund, it will be recorded as a gift for the General Operating Budget.



Required Minimum Distributions:

This identity information, such as your name and directions for your gift, greatly assists our Accounting partners with the correct and timely recording of your gift.
